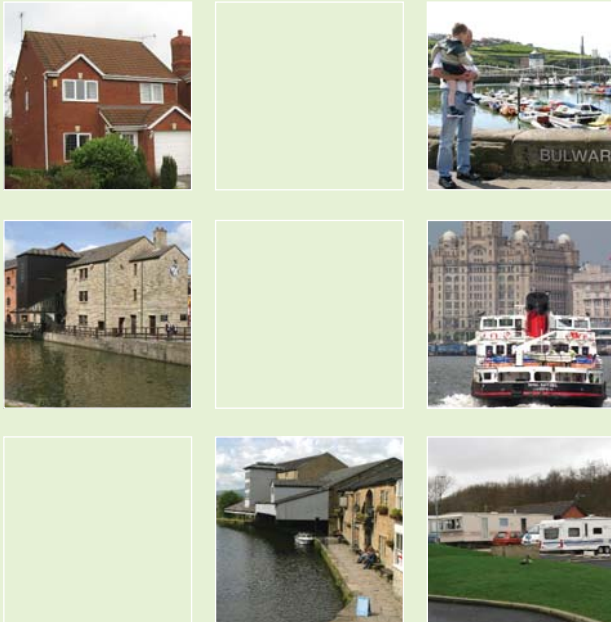

Regional Planning

The North West Regional Assembly is the designated regional planning body for North West of England. This means they have been asked by the government to prepare, monitor and review the Regional Spatial Strategy in partnership with others.



The Regional Spatial Strategy, or North West Plan, is a regional plan that has to be taken into account when decisions are being made about planning applications. It provides a spatial framework for development in the region and for other regional strategies, and it promotes the sustainable development of the North West.

The Partial Review of the North West Plan

Three key issues have been identified that we need to urgently think about.

These are:

- 1 Addressing housing demand, supply and affordability;
- 2 Identifying the broad locations for regionally significant waste management facilities; and
- 3 Identifying the broad location of renewable energy generation facilities.

To think about these issues a partial review of the North West Plan is taking place.



The Partial Review Process

The process of the partial review involves the North West Regional Assembly working with others to look at these three key issues.

This means there are lots of opportunities for you to find out more, influence and comment on plans.

There are three key points at which you can get involved. These are;

- 1 February 2008 and April 2008 - Consultation on the Draft Project Plan and Statement of Public Participation
- 2 June 2008 - Consultation on draft options
- 3 October 2008 to November 2008 - Consultation on interim draft policies

At different times during the process the North West Regional Assembly will be using different ways to talk to people, including a web site, questionnaires and workshops.
